

Timeline for James Campbell Caywood Whalen

Year	Individual event
1886	was born on the 27 th of January in Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee to James Knox Polk Whalen and Malinda Wilcox. Caywood had an older brother, William Harrison, and an older sister, Stella.
1887	His brother, John Roy, was born on the 8 th of April in Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee.
1889	His brother, Carl Danney, was born on the 2 nd of February in Maryville, Blount County, Tennessee.
1895	His mother Malinda Wilcox dies in or before this year (exact year and/or date is not known)
1896	His father marries his second wife, Mary Lane née Blankenship, on the 17 th of September 1896 in Maryville, Blout County, Tennessee. With her, Mary brings two sons from a previous marriage, Willie and Emmett Lane.
1900	According to the 1900 US Federal Census, Caywood is residing in North Cleveland, Bradley County, Tennessee with his father, his stepmother, his three brothers, his sister and two stepbrothers, Willie L. and Emmett Lane.
1902	<p>According to a newspaper article in the Atlanta Constitution, Caywood appears in court in Atlanta, Georgia on the 4th of March and tells the judge that he ran away from home in Cleveland, Bradley County, Tennessee because his stepmother beat him. He is sent to the Fulton County Reformatory.</p> <p>According to a second newspaper article in the Atlanta Constitution, Caywood escapes from the reformatory during the night of the 19th of March and jumps on a train headed north to Tennessee. He gets off the train in Kingston, Bartow County, Georgia and takes a nap. When he wakes up, he is disoriented and mistakenly jumps on a train heading back to Atlanta. In Atlanta he is taken into custody and returned to the reformatory on the 22nd of March.</p>
1910	The 1910 US Federal Census reports that Caywood is a private in the United States Army and is living in Fort Oglethorpe, Catoosa County, Georgia. He states that he is married and that his father's birthplace is Ireland (sic) and his mother's is Scotland (sic). He gives his age as 24.
1918	On the 12 th of September, Caywood Whalen gives his father, James P. Whalen living in Melville, Hamilton County, Tennessee, as his next of kin on his World War I draft registration card. Caywood is living at 231 East 16 th Street, Chicago, Cook County, Illinois and works at St Luke's Hospital as a shoemaker. He gives his age as 32. No mention is made of a wife or children.

Year	Individual event
1940	Caywood is listed in the 1940 US Federal Census as James Maler and is an inmate at the Central State Hospital for the Insane, Murfreesboro Road, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee. His death certificate states that he suffered from manic depressive psychosis - depressive type.
1947	dies on 21 st September in the Central State Mental Hospital, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee of pulmonary tuberculosis which he had for a year before he died. His death certificate lists his name as James Maler (Whalen?). His body donated to medical science, specifically the Tennessee Anatomical Board.
